What is generalisation?

Generalisation is the transfer (and maintenance) of trained knowledge and skills from a training situation to the natural environment. It is often said that the success of an ABA (Applied Behavioural Analysis) program depends largely on the extent to which the child can apply the learnt knowledge and trained skill in the real world environment.

Why play?

ABA involves up to 40 hours per week of intensive one-on-one training. The goal is to promote learning in a way that is motivating and fun while also facilitating the development of appropriate play skills for the child.

Target participants

The workshop is designed for ABA therapists and parents who are actively involved with the process.

The workshop program

This is a hands-on workshop designed to encourage open discussions and sharing of information amongst experienced therapists and others wanting to make the ABA program more effective. The program will cover strategies and practical tips on play and generalisation. There will be also be practical activities and case discussion to help consolidate the days learning.
